PROJECT BACKGROUND

On March 21st of 2004, Veterans Stadium was laid to rest with a record breaking 61-second long implosion. As a result, a mass of concrete and reinforcing steel was left behind. Brandenburg erected the largest known mobile crusher in the United States to process nearly 85,000 cubic yards of concrete in less than four months. The recycled material was used to fill the huge void and the site was graded to make new parking lots.

SCOPE OF WORK

Preserve and remove items that were to be saved including the stadium's field lighting, artificial turf, Liberty Bell figure, and other miscellaneous artifacts

Remove galbestos sheeting from roof section

Remove asbestos containing material throughout stadium

Remove hazardous waste materials

Perform disconnects and removal of utilities

Conventionally remove the first fifty rows of the stadium, all concession stands, bathrooms, etc., demolition on the stadiums main internal and external structures to prepare for implosion

Implode remaining structure

Erecte mobile crusher and process nearly 85,000 cubic yards of concrete for use as fill
